Airline Ambassadors, Kiwanis and the American Medical Association Unite to Help the Children of the World

Our gratitude is extended to the Kiwanis Clubs of El Salvador who have hosted over 100 Airline Ambassador volunteers. These volunteers have been returning to the country to provide thousands of orphans with humanitarian and medical aid. They have assisted with disaster relief efforts after the earthquake that left over 500,000 people homeless.

American Airlines donated a 757 airplane which volunteers filled with donations. These items were hand-delivered to nine different orphanages in early January. Hours after leaving El Salvador, the major earhquake struck. Since then, AAI volunteers have been returning regularly to provide relief supplies, medical support, and housing materials.

President of Kiwanis International, Bo Shafer, a medical team, and a National Geographic crew joined the AAI mission in mid-February. The second major quake hit just after the group's arrival.

AAI doctors rushed to the disaster scene, and team members distributed water, blankets and food. The medical team worked at Cafetelon Refugee Camp, treating over 1,000 patients in one day, identifying 30 patients needing surgery and returned in March to perform them. (Thanks Dr. Tolle and Dr. Arnold.)

Bo Shafer dedicated a new Kiwanis-Airline Ambassador clinic in the indigenous village of Santo Tomas. AAI President, Nancy Rivard, Miami AAI member, Freddy Gomez, and Earl Calleson, of the Wheelchair Foundation, also launched a weekly TV show in San Salvador, where wheelchairs are presented weekly to those in need.

Many thanks to Cameron Gray, the President of Orphans for the World, who has worked for many years for the poor in El Salvador and leads monthly AAI missions there. He is now coordinating a shelter for the

homeless, providing warmth, rehabilitation and guidance through his remarkable support of "Christ in the Streets". This pro-

gram is spearheaded by local young people, who cook a warm meal and deliver it on Friday nights to more than 300 people who sleep in the streets. Thank you also to Danny Robles who

has mobilized donations from American Airlines employees and has returned to San Salvador, personally bringing those donations to families and children in need.

Actress, Loretta Swit, joined an AAI mission in April and has agreed to be our international spokesperson. She will help promote the concept of "Vacationing to do Good" and is helping coordinate a jewelry line and catalogue for Airline Ambassadors. Thank you Loretta - you are our angel!

Airline Ambassadors is experiencing unprecedented growth. We have evolved from a small group of dedicated friends to an organization of 3000 members helping thousands of children in need reflecting countless voluntary hours and resources selflessly given by all of you.

Arline Ambassadors

Along with our successes and our burgeoning growth now come new responsibilities. How can we keep the quality of our missions and continue to produce the quantity of volunteer opportunities demanded by our new members? How can we enlist new resources and international logistics enabling us to serve humanity in a consistent and valuable manner?

We can no longer share "buddy passes" with non-airline members because of growing problems of demand and problems with low priority stand-by for these tickets. We are, for the first time hiring a full time staff member to offer our members the support they need. Our goal is to raise \$20,000 by July 1st for this position. *Please see form on Pg. 6*.

We have managed to keep pace with the demands and responsibilities of a growing new membership by nurturing the incredible talent among us and by partnering with others. We have worked with American, Northwest and United Airlines, the AMA, Kiwanis International, Church of the Latter Day Saints Charities, the U.N. High Commission on Refugees and the Wheelchair Foundation and more. Humanitarian Aid Missions

AAI's humanitarian aid missions provide substantive aid to children in need. We coordinate 2 to 10 missions each month that supply medical and dental care, first aid, babyand school supplies, clothing, sports equipment and toys. These trips offer our members a way to travel and make a difference. Please join us on a "Journey of the Heart".

Building Bridges to Bolivia



Airline Ambassadors traveled to La Paz, Bolivia, in late March with clothing, toys, and school and medical supplies. Linda Gansler and Jeni Guzman led the volunteers in visits to hospitals and orphanages, where they delivered supplies and painted cartoons on orphanage walls. The group also visited Viacha, a town that lost everything due to flooding. Three vans loaded with donations were distributed to very grateful families now living in tents. Before heading home, the Ambassadors appeared on a local TV show featuring their humanitarian efforts.

Blessings to Brazil

An Airline Ambassador team traveled to Rio de Janeiro in March of this year to assist facilities of the Brazilian, Christian-based organization, the Legion of Goodwill. 158 boxes of humanitarian aid were shipped including 100 boxes of toys, reading glasses, school supplies, and blankets from the International Toy Bank. Although hold-ups at customs were disappionting to the volunteers, we are happy to report that ultimately the donations were released from customs and given to the Legion for delivery. Volunteers had a rewarding experience giving a warm meal to those in the flavellas (slums) outside the city.

To the Former Yugoslavia, With Love

AAI volunteers returned again to the former Yugoslavia. They delivered supplies and played with children at a hospital near Zagreb and assisted a group of mentally handicapped children. Each child received a "Magi Gift," which had been prepared by churches, schools, Girl Scout groups, and individuals in a cooperative effort by Manna Int'l and Love into Action Int'l. Toys, diapers, and other items were also distributed. A school in Bihac, repaired as a result of the AAI trip in 1998, received school supplies and toys.

Mission Coordinator Rae England traveled to Kosovo, visiting an institution for the mentally handicapped and preparing a shipment of containers for later this year. Fred Gerhard of the Wheelchair Foundation led another team of volunteers to Sarjevo. The group met the head of logistics for NATO and helped document the delivery of wheelchairs to many needy victims of the recent war.

Donations to the Dominican Republic

AAI members coordinated two missions bringing medical aid, school kits, shoes, toiletries, dried milk, food, clothing, and beanie babies to hundreds of children in orphanages. Thank you to Sharrye Moore for identifying clinics in need and for bringing Felipe Luciano, New York radio and TV personality, to experience an AAI mission first-hand. Glenda Johnson, medical coordinator, befriended a 30-year



old disabled man, whose only mode of transportation was sitting on a small skateboard. Through a series of remarkable coincidences, they met again, and this time, Glenda gave him a wheelchair, changing his life and hers.

AMA in Ecuador

The President of the American Medical Association (AMA), Dr. Randy Smoak, joined a February medical mission to Quito. The group delivered 100 wheelchairs to the First Lady, Ms. Isabela de Noboa, thanks to partner organizations, Wheelchair Foundation and American Airlines. They coordinated a medical and eye clinic at ABEI Infantil, treating over 100 patients. An AAI nurse, Kathy Smith, was also able to deliver 30,000 doses of flu vaccine. \$2000 was donated to ABEI Infantil for needed medical equipment, thanks to the creation of an AAchievers Bank, set up by Gladys Levy (see page 6).

Delivering Diana's Arms

The most touching part of the trip in February to Quito was the delivery of prosthetic arms and hands to Diana. On the last mission, the team learned that while cooking, the 8-yr. old had been electrocuted. Due to an infection, her forearms were amputated. She looked at AAI volunteer, Maria Harrison, and said with a trusting spirit, "Please bring me my arms." "I will do everything I can," said Maria, not knowing how she would be able to accomplish this difficult task. Due to the cooperation of the World Rehabilitation Fund and Hosmer Medical Supply, the renowned prosthetic expert, Maurice LeBlanc, joined the team, delivering her arms, hooks, and hands for little Diana. Her family's tearful thanks warmed the hearts of all.

Thank you to Ancient Forests, Intl. and AAI volunteers who traveled on an ecotour/humanitarian mission to the Amazon in Ecuador. The team helped the indigenous people while learning the importance of preserving the forest.

Giving in Guatemala

Thank you, Barabara Brown, for coordinating this trip to help the C'eqchi people of Rio Dulce. They visited Ak 'Tenamit, a grass roots community project focused on health education and income generation for local people. They journeyed down the river to work at a local health clinic, where health kits and dental care supplies were brought and techniques for use were demonstrated. They also distributed school kits at a local school. The next day, the team built stoves for the local residents.

Myrna Freeman led the next mission to deliver rainboots and supplies to assist the children at Vamos Adelante, enabling hundreds of children to walk to school and continue their education during the rainy season.

Helping in Haiti

This medical mission to remote Juampas treated 1200 patients! Ground was broken to begin building the first medical/dental clinic in the area as a direct result of the efforts of Glenda Johnson and Marlene and John Olivier. The entire community participated, children carried stones to the site, women carried water on their heads, as men dug trenches. Many thanks to Bill Timm and Mt. Carroll Church group who helped raise \$8,000 for the effort. The local school received clothes, shoes and school supplies as well.

Mother Teresa's in India

Airline Ambassador, Rosalie Giffoniello, spent several months in Calcutta, transforming Daya Dan Orphanage from a custodial care facility into a learning environment. When she requested a physical therapist to help, Jodi Williamson-Horsman and a team of 7 volunteers, set out for India. The team provided physical therapy assessments, taught children how to sit, stand and operate a walker or wheelchair. They delivered medical supplies, children's clothes, toys and 10 wheelchairs, provided by the Wheelchair Foundation. The AAI team gave love, compassion and the gift of mobility to these orphans who were able to now go to the zoo for the first time. Sister Nirmula was so grateful, she referred to the volunteers as the "Wheelchair Oueens of Calcutta." AAI was able to arrange the delivery of 42 more wheelchairs following their visit and hopes to send regular AAI teams to Calcutta in the future.

Mission to the Middle East

Airline Ambassadors joined Fred Gerhard of the Wheelchair Foundation in distributing 1,000 wheelchairs to both sraeli hospitals and Palestinian refugee camps along the Gaza Strip. AAI volunteers also took 475 beanie babies to give to children on this remarkable effort helping both sides of the Middle East conflict.

Support for Mexico

Despite a little rain, the mission to San Quintin was a huge success! Airline Ambassadors' mission coordinator, Sheran James, and AAI volunteers hand-delivered 4500 toys, 2200 blankets, 1700 sweaters, 20 wheelchairs, 10 bicycles, medical and schools supplies for the children and families of the San Quintin community. The volunteers visited a village where 35 families live in cardboard houses, and brought them food and blankets also. Thank you to the Homeowner Association of La Mision, who arranged for the transportation and lodging of all the AAI volunteers. Another team returned shortly after the first group left, bringing more supplies and love to the people of San Quintin.

Trekking in Nepal

Airline Ambassadors traveled to Nepal to participate in a dramatic 8-day trek to the Langtang Region delivering medical supplies to 6 remote village clinics against a spectacular backdrop of the majestic Himalayas. An AAI team, led by Glenda Johnson, offered a free health clinic to help 1500 people who could not afford hospital or doctor visits. Joel Hodge, of the Wheelchair Foundation, coordinated the delivery of 1000 wheelchairs to those in need in Katmandu. Members interviewed and documented each person receiving a wheelchair. The gratitude of the Nepalese people was overwhelming.


this creative way of raising awareness and bringing Compassion into Action!


