Airline Ambassadors in New York decided to channel the pain and grief that filled their hearts after the World Trade Center disaster towards helping... giving coffee to a rescue worker, listening to a distraught family member, bringing a blanket to a child cold from the rain. The outpouring of human goodness was inspiring. This newsletter is dedicated to those who lost their lives on that day and the days that followed, in New York, Washington and around the world.

Dozens of AAI'ers volunteered at the Armory the week following the tragedy comforting families of victims, serving policemen and volunteers. Barbara McDonald became the darling of the soldiers, coordinated thousands of dollars worth of donations and was the first of our team to be escorted to Ground Zero, bringing coffee and comfort to the heroic relief workers. Within two days Airline Ambassadors had 200 members certified to work with the Red Cross. Loretta Swit, AAI's

Wheelchair Foundation



Humanitarian Aid Missions



The mission to the **Philippines** arrived in Manila on September 11th to find out of the tragedy unfolding in the U.S. Since AAI has an ongoing relationship with three facilities, the distribution of dozens of boxes of supplies was welcomed by each host. An additional \$3,200 was brought to Auntie Fe, the mother at our special orphanage, Shepherd of the Hill. Our hearts go out to the children there, especially now, since Auntie Fe passed away soon after our visit. At each location, the team was greeted with banners such as, "Welcome Our Beloved Airline Ambassadors...Glad to See You Again." So during our nation's greatest tragedy, AAIers were doing something great for some deserving people who's future may be just a little brighter as a result.

During Cameron Gray's monthly visits to El Salvador he has hand-delivered hundreds of thousands worth of humanitarian

aid. Some of his mission activities include feeding the homeless through a program he funds, Christ in the Streets, and hand-delivering aid to remote communities rarely visited where military escorts are sometimes needed. Lately he has scheduled an 8 hour guided tour at the end of the mission, giving visitors an opportunity to do some shopping, and visit Mayan archaeological sites, art galleries, and attractions one should not miss when visiting El Salvador.

In October, the AAIers traveled to a 7 day-care centers in Quito, Ecuador. These chil-



Children's Escort Program

Airline Ambassadors' Escorts bring children to the U.S. for adoption or for medical procedures that cannot be performed in the child's home country. They provide a warm and comforting presence.

A NOTE FROM MARGARET WHITEHEAD, PROGRAM DIRECTOR

Many of our escorts call expressing how rewarding it had been to escort a child; yet, there have been a few who have reported some negatives. Escorting is simply not for everyone.

It isn't easy having to deal with late or canceled flights, sick or crying children, carrying a baby or toddler plus sometimes two carry on bags through the Miami airport, finally arriving in a foreign city with nobody there to meet you...these are just a few of the problems that our escorts have encountered.

One absolutely MUST be flexible and resourceful. Go with an open mind and expect the unexpected. The escort is a very important part of the healing process for the child. The little glitches that sometimes occur during a trip mean very little when compared with the good health and the new life given a child who had no chance before coming to the United States.

Finally, I would like to simply say "THANK YOU," to those members who on days off, could have taken a little fun trip somewhere or simply stayed home and relaxed. You knew there was a little one waiting and you said, "What can I do to help?" You have made a huge difference in that child's life.

I arrived at the Guatemala City airport at 5:00 AM to escort 6 vear-old Juan Carlos to Chicago, IL for surgery. He was leaving his family for 10 months. As I took his hand and he bid farewell to his family, tears and whimpers

could be seen and heard as we walked down the jet bridge. The cabin crew was wonderful. They welcomed him warmly and the first officer who spoke Spanish invited him into the cockpit. He put Juan Carlos in the Captain's seat with the Captain's hat on and the frown turned into a big smile.

As I escort children, I am so appreciative to the cockpit and cabin crews who make these frightened, home-sick children feel so very special.

My First Escort

I really took to heart to little 2 ½ year old Winny Windolyn). She was absolutely adorable. Before the flight even took off from Newark, N.J. Winny had

ERICA'S STORY

I met Erica one year ago at a local children's hospital in El Salvador. She was 7 months old, weighing 6 pounds 4 ounces. Her mother had abandoned her because

she had been born with clubbed feet. No one knows how many days poor little Erica laid hungry and crying before a woman named Santos washing clothing, heard God's angel crying. She searched the riverbank, discovering Erica wrapped in brown paper with her little body covered in ants and maggots. Santos took her home. The family cleaned her up and built a wooden box to bury little Erica, figuring she would not live through the day.

God had different plans for His little angel. The next two days were touch and go. Santos and her husband, who were very poor, mashed beans to feed her. Although it was difficult, they raised the cash needed to take her to the hospital.

AAI was in El Salvador on a medical mission. Our group, hosted by Sandra Garcia, received a phone call about little Erica and the plight of her story. A group of us immediately went to the hospital. The first sight of this baby brought tears to our eyes, as she lay crying without tears. I went to her bedside, her little arms reaching to be picked up. Holding her little frail body stole my soul. Her new adoptive mother, Santos, was frightened that we would take Erica from her.

Since then, Dr. Mike Toll has arranged surgery at Scotish Right Hospital in Dallas. I escorted both the mother and Erica to Dallas for the reconstructive surgery.
