A Message of Thanks and Appreciation



AIRLINE AMBASSADORS is sincerely grateful for your continued generous help and participation. With the support of our members and partners, last year we were able to personally improve the lives of 1,096 children in 21 countries.

In 2016 we hand delivered thousands of pounds of medicine, medical supplies, food, clothing and school supplies on nine humanitarian missions directly to 860 children in need. Our volunteers also provided a loving escort for 236 children and orphans for life changing journeys and provided 18 human trafficking awareness trainings enabling the effective scanning of 46 MILLION travelers.

AIRLINE AMBASSADORS is the first international aid and development organization to operate within the airline industry. We effectively leverage capabilities within our industry to provide low cost transportation, transport of goods, customs or logistical and direct aid delivery to disaster regions, as well as to orphanages, clinics and remote communities. We have grown to thousands of members that act as a human link connecting world resource to world need.

As a nonprofit organization affiliated with the United Nations we support the Sustainable Development Goals. With that focus we have made significant contributions to our world community addressing issues of poverty and hunger, child welfare, education, health and community development. Since 2010 we have taken the lead on the largest human rights issue of our time, raising awareness on the issue of human trafficking prevention.

We also positively impacted hundreds of volunteers with inspiring opportunities to bring compassion into action. Our members deepened their understanding of global inequity, respect for diverse cultures, and appreciation of our common humanity.

For every dollar donated, we directly delivered \$20.9 directly to thousands of impoverished children. With a bare minimum of donations going to administrative costs we have been able to achieve more than we had ever expected or hoped.

Clearly, we could not accomplish our work without the support of our volunteers, the airlines and local partners including dozens of non-profits, businesses and local governments. This letter of thanks and appreciation goes out to all our benefactors who have generously contributed their resources, time and passion to those who await our help worldwide.

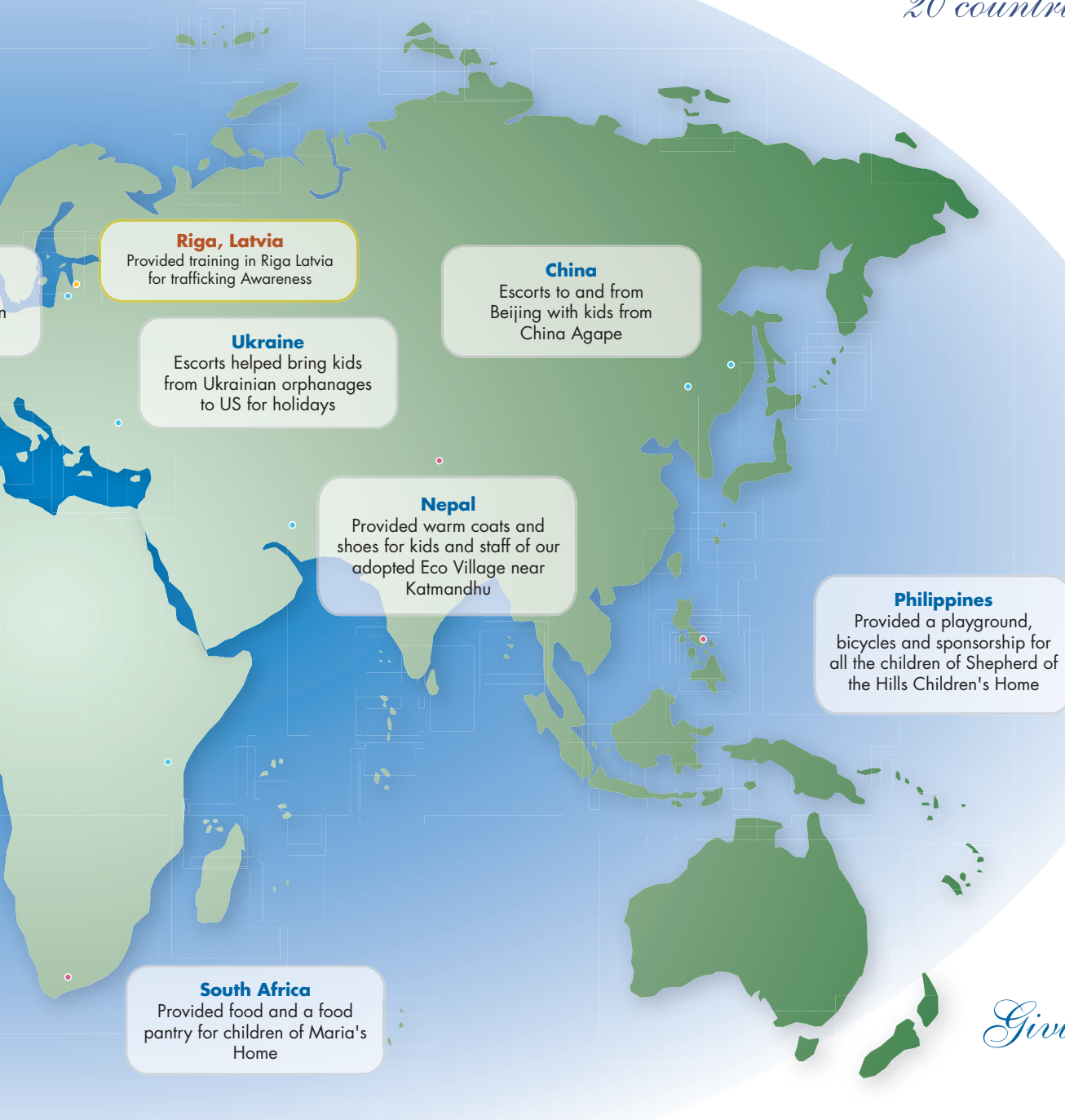

Our Vision

AIRLINE AMBASSADORS INTERNATIONAL is a leading advocate for children and vulnerable populations, and the only nonprofit organization that leveraging resources of the travel industry. Through leveraging strategic alliances and human resources, we bring compassion into action and give individuals opportunities to provide extraordinary humanitarian service to one another.



AIRLINE AMBASSADORS INTERNATIONAL has demonstrated that development assistance works best under the direction and invitation of those we assist. We have made long term commitments to the projects we support and have expanded Human Trafficking training as a key way to address prevention in the fastest growing criminal industry in the world.

Typically, relief and development organizations restrict donor involvement to contributions and rely on highly paid humanitarian professionals who restrict project visitation by ordinary citizens. While certain projects might certainly warrant such protocol, we believe that people from all walks of life have skills to offer in making communities whole again.. The additional human resources we enable and provide bridge vital gaps in assistance shortfalls.

While there is not an abundance of resources in an increasing number of communities, there is an abundance of human spirit that we are placing, leveraging and nurturing.

Airline Ambassadors International's philosophy is one of love in action by connecting generous volunteers and donors to assist children and vulnerable populations. Our actions are guided by the following principles and values:

- Compassion and goodwill
- Integrity and transparency
- Selflessness and generosity
- Service to vulnerable populations
- Inclusiveness in building community
- Appreciation and respect for unity in diversity

The Airline Ambassadors elements of service include:

- A greater leverage of resources that can be created by developing the "human element." This human element consists of a greater sense of responsibility by both the giver and the aid recipient.
- Local independence and self-determination, which is the ultimate objective of any development or aid. We link the above elements of service with aid, funding and professional service delivery to provide training and education for our volunteers. Our model provides a "continuity of care" element, which is emblematic of Airline Ambassadors projects in 60 countries.
- Our humanitarian model has unleashed creativity and resources heretofore untapped. In 2016, our volunteers contributed 1,896 hours of volunteer service and spent thousands of dollars of personal income. They directly helped 1,096 children.

Children's Medical Escort Program

AIRLINE AMBASSADORS contracts with various adoption agencies and nonprofits to provide volunteer escorts for children in need of medical care not available in their home countries or for orphans going to their new homes. These Airline Ambassadors are airline personnel who use their flight privileges to provide a loving and capable adult companion for

these disadvantaged children at a fraction of the cost to adoption agencies, health care partners or individuals requiring our service. We also escort children coming from Ukraine and Poland for the summer and winter holidays to stay with foster families.

In 2016 we escorted 236 children, to and from 13 countries representing 4, 720 service hours an in-kind value of \$472,000.

Humanitarian Missions

AIRLINE AMBASSADORS coordinates missions every month where members hand deliver medical supplies, first aid kits, school supplies, clothing, blankets, and medicine to refugee camps, orphanages, clinics, schools, and remote communities. We also provide opportunities for medical professionals, teachers, builders, and travelers of all ages and professions to share their unique skills and expertise to benefit local communities..

We hand delivered aid to in Guatemala, Mexico, Nepal, Nicaragua, Philippines and South Africa We also provided medical care for children in Nicaragua and sponsorships for every orphan at Shepherd of the Hills Children's Home in the Philippines. In 2016, we delivered \$22,974 of humanitarian aid on nine humanitarian missions directly impacting 860 children.

Human Trafficking Awareness

AIRLINE AMBASSADORS developed the first training on human trafficking awareness tailored specifically for the airline and travel industry. AAI provides a team of four trainers to present a 90 minute training at airports or other locations with handouts and scenarios as well as pre and post assessments, wallet cards and handouts. Trainings include stories from a survivor of human trafficking as well as stories of flight attendants and others who have identified trafficking in real case scenarios. AAI is the chief advocate in the travel industry for awareness of this fast growing crime and this year our advocacy in Congress was successful with the passage of the FAA Reauthorization Act, requiring all flight attendants to be trained!

AAI's TIP Line APP, developed in 2015, is a reporting platform and social media network, applauded by UNODC as an excellent source of Trafficking in Person's information and promoted at all airport trainings in 2016. Additionally, AAI developed a new C-TIP App only available to AAI trainees enabling state of the art anonymous encryption for law enforcement reporting and data collection. The new CTIP App was co-developed by Georgia Tech University and support from the University of Washington DC. HiFive has additionally donated resources for completion of this state of the art App in 2017.

In 2016, we provided 13 airport trainings in San Francisco, San Jose, Oakland, Amsterdam, Riga, Bogota, Las Vegas, San Diego, Washington DC, Dulles, Dallas ft. Worth, Houston, Atlanta and Aruba and presentations with the movie SOLD in Kansas City, Salt Lake City and Atlanta to 1,923 front line employees and enabling the effective scanning of 46 MILLION travelers!

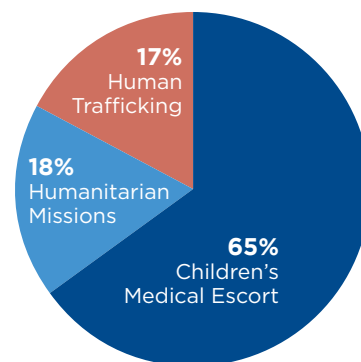

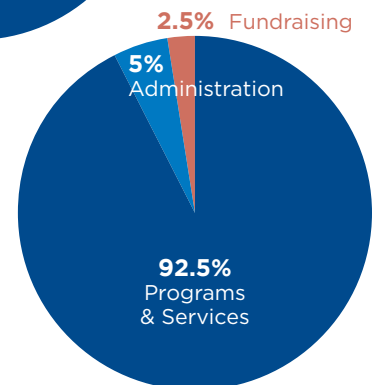
